

A.S. Jenks Elementary School Parent and Family Engagement Policy

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, A.S. Section A: JOINTLY DEVELOPED

A.S. Jenks Elementary School will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

In the Spring, parents are encouraged to attend a meeting in which they could review and give input into this document, as well as the School-Parent Compact. This process is undertaken annually and this year occurred on May 24, 2024

Section B: ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

A.S. Jenks Elementary Schoolwill take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents' requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, and the school-parent compact.

The Annual Title I meeting is conducted during Back to School Night and will take place in September 2024. All parents are invited to participate and provide input to enhance the relationshp between the school and families. During this meeting, the Principal or designee will inform them about the Title I program; state standards and assessments; the school plan and budget; and curriculum, progress monitoring, working with educators, and how to get involved with the school. Parents will be notified by flyer in Class Dojo, monthly calendar and telephone.

A.S. All families will be provided with the Parent and Family Engagement Policy and School-Parent Compact, and these documents are also uploaded to our website. Parents are notified about various meetings, online assemblies, and events during the school year via a variety of methods. These include flyers, monthly calendars, Class Dojo, with students, as well as through a phone blast. Meetings, trainings and workshops are held at various times of the day via Zoom to accommodate all families and their schedules. All communications sent home are in the family home language. Any translation can be made available upon request and Bilingual Counseling Assistants attend meetings as necessary.

Parents will conference on the child(ren)'s academic progress three times a year. We will work to coordinate conferences at different times of day in order to best accommodate the schedules of parents/families. These will be held as follows: November 15, 2024; January 30-31 - 2, 2025; and, March 27-28, 2025.

Interim reports will be shared by the following dates: September 23, 2024; December 9, 2024; February 19, 2025; and, May 2, 2025.

Section D: SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT

A.S. Jenks Elementary School will take the following actions to jointly develop with parents of participating children a school-parent compact that outlines how parents, the entire school staff, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership to help children achieve the state's high standards.

In the Spring of each year, parents are encouraged to attend a meeting during which they have the opportunity to review and give input into this document, as well as the Parent and Family Engagement Policy. The school hosts a Parent Resource area which is available to families and Jenks staff and administrators coordinate with local Pre-Ks to facilitate the transition into Kindergarten.

A.S. Jenks Elementary School will build the parents' capacity for strong parent and family engagement to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school and the community to improve student academic achievement through the following:

Various workshops, trainings, and other offerings are presented to parents throughout the school year. Some of the topics are: Math homework; PSSA meeting/workshop; writing celebration; accessing the Parent Portal. Parents will attend meetings to learn how to use technology and programs to support their child's academic and social emotional growth. Resources and support will be provided during MTSS and IEP meetings.

During the Annual Title I meeting, held each September, we share with parents the requirements of Title I, Part A, the State's academic standards, local academic assessments and how to work with educators. There are three report card conferences throughout the school year (outlined above) with an evening conference offered each time. During these conferences teachers will discuss with parents how to monitor their child's progress.

Section H: BUILDING CAPACITY OF SCHOOL STAFF

A.S. Jenks Elementary School will provide training to educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school by:
